on July 6, 2026, the National Institute of Public Administration and Management (INAMP), in partnership with the Regional Project for Public Administration Reform within the Eastern Partnership (EaP PAR), launched the "Training for Trainers" Program, a strategic initiative aimed at developing a new generation of trainers who will contribute to the modernization of public administration.

Held in the INAMP premises, the Program, organized over five days, brings together trainers from the INAMP Trainer Network and promotes a modern learning model, focused on the development of skills, the practical application of knowledge and the strengthening of institutional performance.

The opening event was attended by Eter Chachanidze, Team Leader of the project, and Vitalie Iovița, Deputy Director of INAMP, who reconfirmed the joint commitment of INAMP and GIZ to strengthen public administration through investments in human capital.

The program is facilitated by Hans-Joachim Rieger and Irina Aghapishvili, representatives of DBB Akademie (Germany), international experts in adult learning, public administration reform, strategic management, leadership and organizational development.

Continuous investment in the development of trainers generates the strongest multiplier effect in building a professional public administration, resilient and prepared to meet the challenges of the future.
